4 - Report of teachers –

Seth E-Learning

Concept came first in 2019, from the Ford government – policies and budget cuts.

This was well before pandemic...came out on the heels of the labour dispute. Now down to two mandatory courses, but students can opt out.

Concerns from staff about this program

- Courses will have no live instruction
- Students will take the course from home or at school, no teacher.
- Students can opt out but barriers to this opting out process, which will
- Boards are being forced by the Ministry to show parents a script that indicates they've been made aware of the policy of opting out, -digital future. Etc. claims not based in

research.

Public resistance, teachers reacting. Government is clear that they will do it ..

You are allowed to opt-out.

HOWEVER, they are funding as they are happening.

Schools will feel this by teacher cuts and course cuts.

It's unclear, but it will likely result in having to take that e-learning elsewhere.

The province will get to bake in the cuts.

Why - funded average is 30:1 - Thirty students to 1 teacher...and in-school class is 22:1.

Save money, and eventually will lead to a loss of teacher allocation.

Ford asking teachers to run these at school, but have a central roster of teachers.

It's not synchronous. Not like covid learning. It's run centrally, and students will need to do it all on their own.

Education staff – asking that it can be an option, but don't make it mandatory. And fund the difference, fund what students want.

Board is trying to sort through the consequences for students who opt out. And it's unclear what it means. Can't exceed class caps, but it does mean it will likely increase class size.

Also waiting to see what happens with the election this year, and if that changes funding for education.

The more people who opt out, the more compelling the story is that it's not sustainable for staffing purposes. The future is unknown.

Collective action is always the best advocacy. Teachers organizing efforts. Parents are starting to form around this issue as well.
