We continue to hold space for our BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Colour) students and staff, particularly our Black community members at this time. 4. UFA Summer Book Club Readings dealing with Anti-Black Racism

Summer Book Club -- Reading on Race: teachers are engaging in some summer reading to help us continue to build our understanding and capacity to discuss anti-Black racism. When we have a clearer understanding of how school will look in the fall, we will decide what form these book clubs will take. Teachers will be reading one of the following books:

- a) White Fragility by Robin DiAngelo
- b) The Skin We're In by Desmond Cole
- c) Policing Black Lives by Robyn Maynard
- d) So You Want To Talk About Race by Ijeoma Oluo

Students are invited to also pursue some independent reading on these topics, these books or some of the many others. In placing our book orders, we have discovered that all titles are sold out everywhere, and we are awaiting new print runs. Waiting lists at Toronto Public Library are also quite lengthy, so we suggest you place your hold as soon as possible.

<u>5. Report Card Distribution (this was centrally distributed yesterday by the Board)</u>

Dear Families,

Due to the current school closures resulting from COVID-19, final report cards will be distributed to TDSB students and parents/guardians in a digital format using School Messenger, an email communication system currently used by schools. Individual Education Plan (IEP) Summaries will also be provided and distributed in a digital format, if applicable.

As per Ontario Student Records (OSR) guidelines, a signed, printed copy of the report card will be filed in the OSR when schools reopen.

The TDSB will take the following steps to deliver a report card for each student in a secure manner:

- 1. You will receive an email with the report card attached as a password-protected PDF file.
 - Secondary report cards will be emailed to both parents/guardians and students' TDSB email address between July 3 8.
- 2. The password will be unique for each report card.
- 3. The password format will be communicated in each email, not the password itself.

If you prefer not to receive your child's report card via email, please use the unsubscribe link at the bottom of this message. To adjust your preferences, deselect "Report Card" and click "Update Preferences" to save the changes. Parents/guardians who opt out of an email delivered report card will receive a printed copy upon request when schools reopen.

6. TDSB Information Technology Services (ITS) Reminders For Students

<u>Student accounts</u> will remain active over the summer and their passwords will not expire. As a result, student account passwords will not be centrally reset for school opening. Students also have access to Password Manager to reset forgotten passwords, but they must set up and then answer their challenge questions in advance. Should students require assistance, please direct them to <u>Student Password/Device Help</u>.

TDSB accounts for graduating students or students leaving the TDSB will be made inactive after the summer, in September. To prepare, students will need to either move/download your content using <u>Google Takeout</u> or use <u>Google Transfer</u> to move your content to your personal Google account. This is information (ITS) has already sent out to all Grade 12 students through an email.
